AMENDMENT 1

WATER AND LAND CONSERVATION



Amendment 1 represents the most important effort in a generation to protect Florida's natural treasures including our wildlife, waterways, and open spaces. This amendment would provide dedicated revenue for water and land conservation without new taxes. Amendment 1 would dedicate 33% of revenue from the doc stamp tax towards the Land Acquisition Trust Fund, providing a stable source of revenue to purchase and maintain conservation lands. Gov. Scott and his allies in the legislature have repeatedly cut investments for critical land conservation efforts.

AMENDMENT 2





Amendment 2 would help deliver compassionate care for Floridians suffering from a wide range of illnesses and chronic conditions like cancer, HIV, Parkinson's disease, and

more. The amendment would legalize medical marijuana for those with "debilitating diseases as determined by a licensed Florida physician" and provide for its regulation by the Florida Department of Health. Medical marijuana has already been passed by voters in ten states and Washington, D.C.

AMENDMENT 3





Amendment 3 is another partisan attack on our courts by Gov. Scott's allies in the legislature that ignores the will of

Florida voters. The amendment would change the way judges are appointed to the state court system. Currently, a governor cannot fill a vacancy in the court system until a judge's term is expired. This amendment would effectively allow an outgoing governor to "prospectively" appoint new judges before their term expired, and therefore prevent a newly elected governor from appointing judges. This amendment is a solution in search of a problem, There is no need at all to change the current system of judicial appointments.
